The meeting was brought to order by the Director of Public Participation. He stated the purpose of public participation in relation to IDeP and ISUDP, and welcomed a member of the public to open the meeting with a word of prayer at 11:52 a.m.

a. Sub-County Administrator

The Sub-County administrator opened the meeting with a brief introduction of the esteemed guests in attendance. He invited each of them to introduce themselves where all gave a resounding message of support toward the role of IDeP & ISUDP in steering growth and development in the municipality. He gave a briefing on the meeting's agenda, emphasizing the potential benefits of the exercise in bringing business, tourism, employment and investment to the municipality.

b. Director of Surveys

Director of Survey introduced and highlighted the roles of the planning team mandated to undertake ISUDP & IDeP.

The Director also reflected on his presence during the institutionalization of the municipality and congratulated the public on their ongoing growth initiatives.

c. Manager Engineer Municipality

Manager gave a highlight on the potential ways the municipality could gain from the implementation of the development plans and invited the program coordinator, Director Rachel to explain ISUDP & IDeP to the public.

d. Director for Physical Planning

The Director for Physical Planning took the floor to give purpose to the public participation exercise. In her briefing, she was able to sensitize the public on:

- The role of planning as a tool to envision the future i.
- The importance of the functionality of a municipality ii.
- The role of planning in addressing emerging issues that arise with iii. growth such as waste management, sewerage treatment, security and availability of water.
- The importance of collaboration in the process of planning in order to iv. be more effective in identifying opportunities and challenges.
- The role of public participation in creating impactful change towards V. the development of communities.

The Director opened the floor for presentation by members of the technical team.

Presentation of the extent of the engineer boundary was carried out by e. Base Map Presentation Cartographer Henry Ngaruiya. He also highlighted the key infrastructures found within the municipality and outlined the centers lying along the boundary. The planning team agreed to use IEBC boundaries for the exercise.

f. ISUDP Presentation

Presentation on the meaning and role of ISUDP in development was done by Plan. Benson Thuku. The presenter gave an overview of objectives, benefits, legal frameworks and process involved in a strategic plan.

Some of the Urbanization challenges identified during the exercise include:

- i. Uncontrolled development due to lack of updated land use plan.
- ii. Inadequate infrastructure i.e. water, sewer and roads to support a fast-growing town/population growing at a rate of 10% in the last 10 years.
- Poor housing and mushrooming informal settlements. iii.
- Loss of agricultural land due to unguided land use changes and iv. sub-divisions.
- High youthful population faced with unemployment, financial V. instability and social exclusion.
- Weak revenue base vi.
- Weak enforcement of planning standards and guidelines. vii.
- Low-value addition of agricultural products. viii.

g. IDeP Presentation

Presentation of the meaning and role of the Integrated Development Plan was done by Plan. Eunice Kamau. She also presented proposals that could be used to counter challenges identified:

- Improvement of access roads
- Infrastructural development i.e. solid waste management, water ii. reticulation, electricity, sewage treatment, stormwater drainage
- Development of markets and improvement of existing ones iii.
- Agriculture and livestock research. iv.
